## SDG 13 – Climate Action is central to Sustainable Development Goals



- Climate change is caused by human activities and is threatening the way we live and the future of our planet
- Climate change is not limited to one area of the world; rather it is a universal challenge that affects everyone in the world, but it disproportionately affects the poorest and most vulnerable, women and children, indigenous people, people with disabilities among others.
- It is currently disrupting economies, affecting lives and countries very dearly, and these effects are bound to continue if remedial steps are not taken.
- Climate change effects include evolving weather patterns, extreme weather event, and a rising sea level.
